including art, music, written distribution of any material created by anyone other than yourself may constitute copyright infringement which is a violation of federal law and University policy. with copyright laws and the provisions of licensing agreements that apply to software. In addition, all systems users agree in the Boston College Technical and Information Resources Use Agreement to comply with copyright law.

The University imposes significant penalties for infringement activities including university probation and loss of network access. In addition, under the Copyright Act, anyone infringing a copyrighted work is liable for civil damages. If willful infringement is proven, the infringer may also be subject to criminal penalties, including fines and imprisonment. For significant offenses, these penalties include up to a five-year federal prison term and a fine of \$250,000. Prohibited activities include using the Boston College network or software without copyright holder permission.
