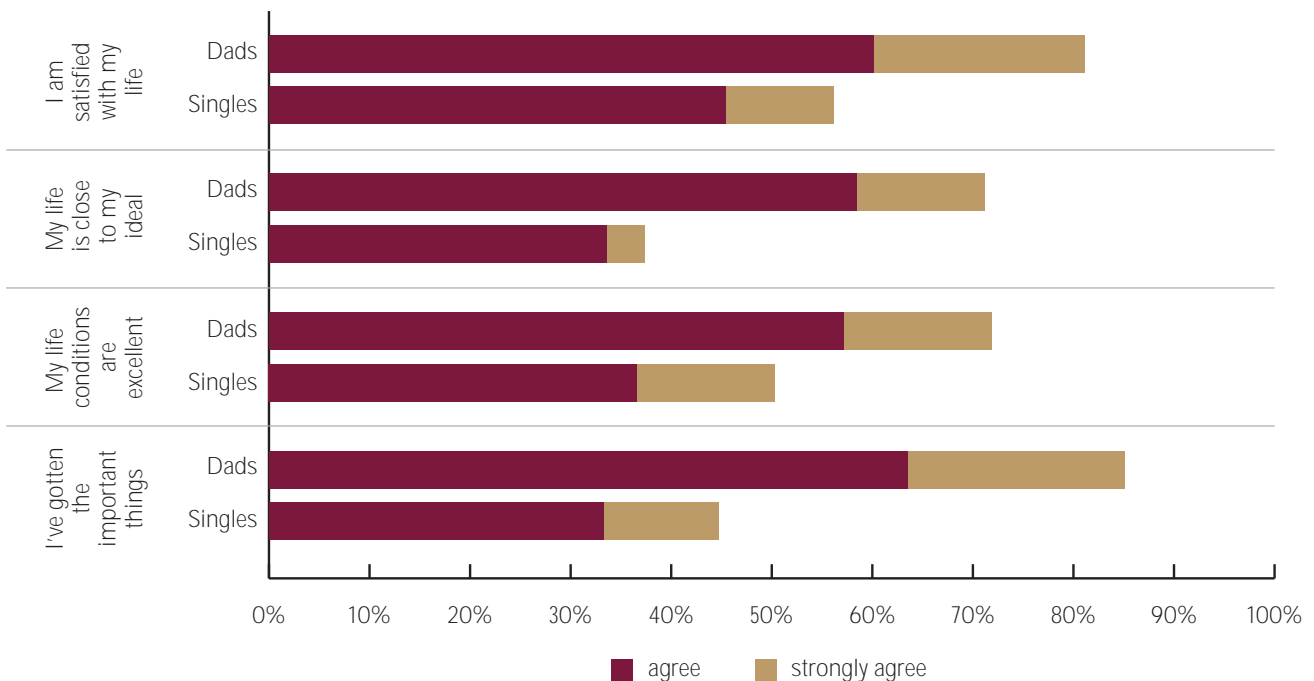

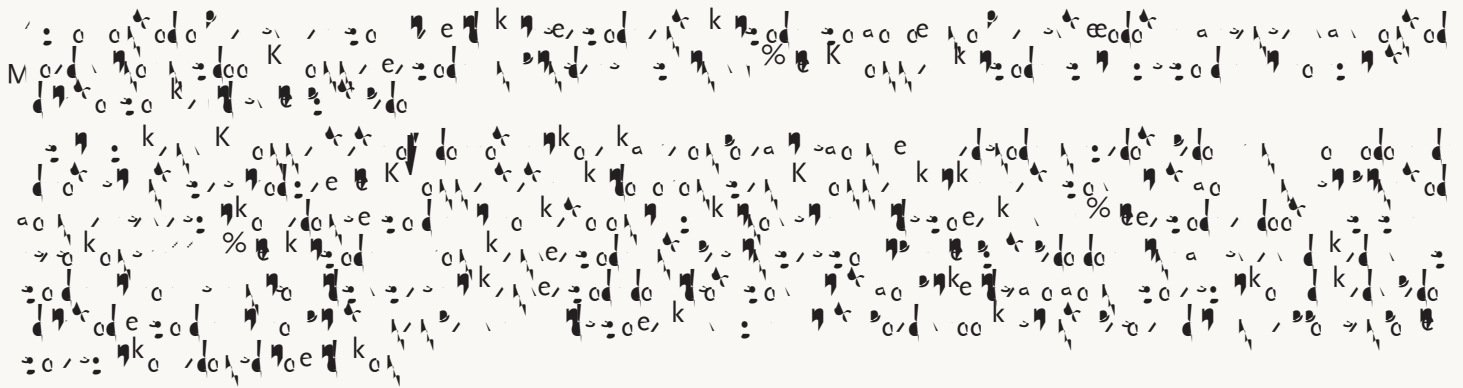

Life Satisfaction (comparing Dads and Single Men)





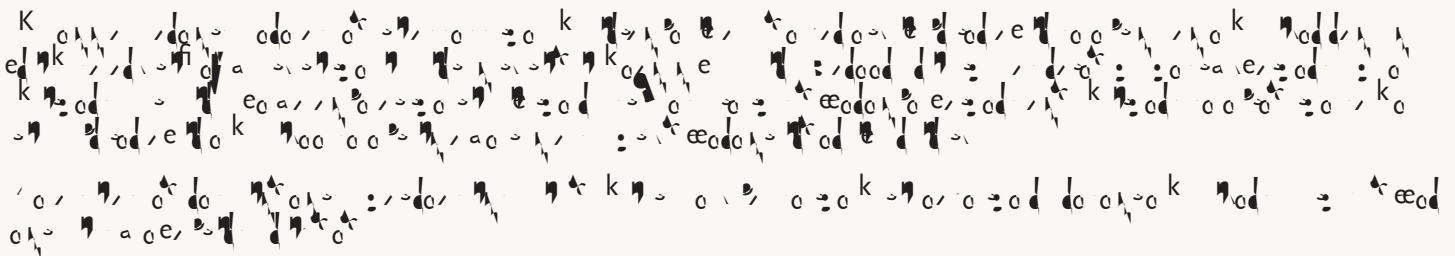

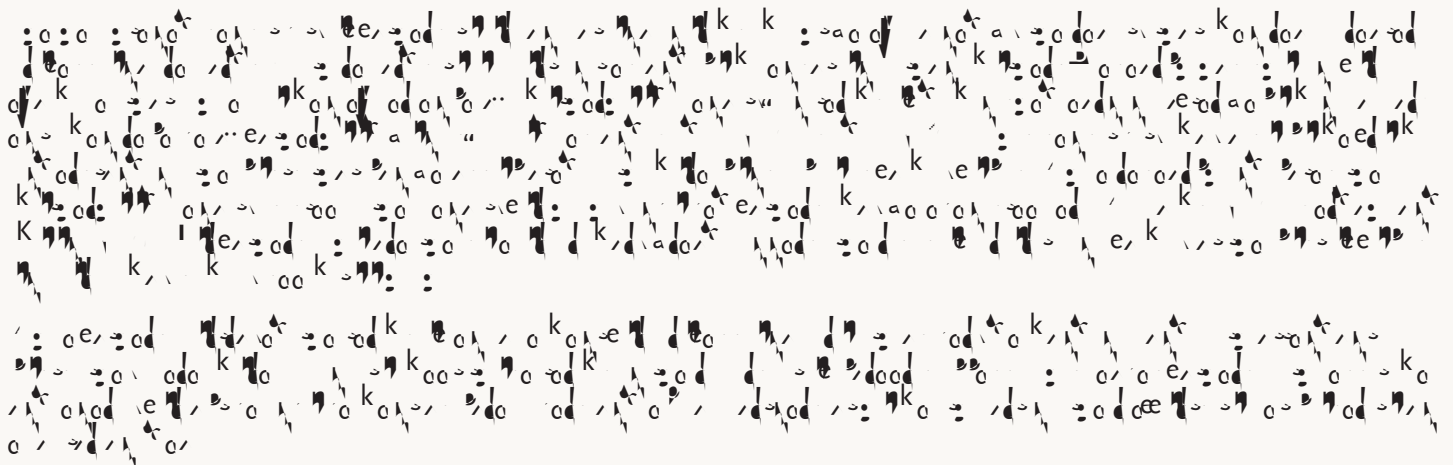

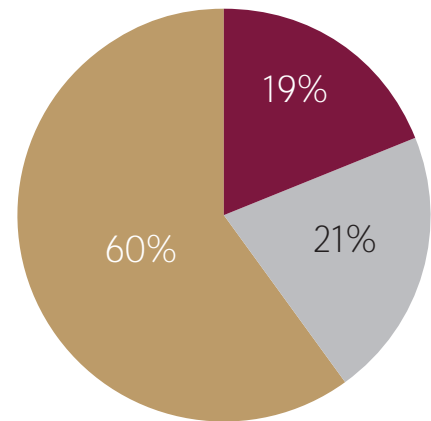
